

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
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Important Safety Instructions

13. Unplug this device during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time.
14. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel. 18. The mains plug of the power supply cord shall remain readily operable.
19. Protective earthing terminal. The apparatus should be connected to a mains socket with a protective earthing connection.

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WARNING - When The Device Is In Use

- WARNING: For the terminals marked with symbol of ⚡ may be of sufficient magnitude to constitute a risk of electric shock. The external wiring connected to the terminals requires installation by an instructed person or the used of ready-made leads or cords.
- WARNING: The apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing and that objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall not be placed on apparatus.
- WARNING: The mains plug is used as disconnect device, the disconnect device shall remain readily operable.
- To prevent electric shock, do not remove the product cover as there are high voltage components inside. Refer all servicing to AtlasIED.
- Should any of the following irregularities occur during use, immediately switch off the power, disconnect the power cord from the AC outlet and contact AtlasIED. Do not to attempt to continue operation with the product as this may cause fire or electric shock:
 - Smoke or strange smell coming from the unit.
 - If the product falls or the case is damaged.
 - If water or any metallic objects falls into the product.
 - If the power supply cord is damaged in any way.
 - If the unit is malfunctioning.
- Do not insert or drop metallic objects or flammable materials into the ventilation holes of the product's cover, as this may result in electric shock or fire.
- Do not place any containers with liquid or metallic objects on the top of the product. If any liquid spills into the unit, fire or electric shock may result.
- Never operate this product or touch the power supply cord during an electrical storm, electric shock may result.
- Never exceed the power rating on the product when connecting equipment. Fire and/or property damage may result.
- Operate the product only with the voltage specified on the unit. Fire and/or electric shock may result if a higher voltage is used.
- Do not modify, kink, or cut the power cord. Do not place the power cord in close proximity to heaters and do not place heavy objects on the power cord, including the product itself, doing so may result in fire or electrical shock.

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Introduction

Thank you for purchasing this AtlasIED Network IP Power Distribution system. This document is designed to provide a high-level overview of the network IP power distribution system product family, including common features to all models. AtlasIED recommends visiting www.atlasied.com/ip-enabled-power-distribution and downloading the AP-IP discovery software to a computer running the Windows® operating system. Other related guides for the AtlasIED AP-IP Power Distribution systems can also be downloaded there.

The AP-IP power distribution systems are remote or locally controlled AC power distribution management systems with power conditioning, surge protection and LAN monitoring. Each AP-IP features a local display and a web-based user interface (UI) that can monitor voltage, current, temperature and humidity. Through the UI, alarms can be set to alert users when a fault condition has occurred via the network UI or fault contacts. Models AP-S15IP and AP-S15HRIP include rear outlets that are programmable and can be scheduled to sequence On / Off individually or in groups on a 24-hour / 7-day schedule. Each AC outlet has a front panel LED status indicator that can also be used to manually turn the outlet On or Off. This feature can be disabled via the UI for increased security. A front panel unswitched AC outlet is also included.

The AP-IP power distribution systems can be automatically identified when connected to a LAN using the AP-IP discovery software running on a connected computer running Windows®. The AtlasIED model AP-LEDIP, LED display, is included to provide a visual reference of the voltage, current, temperature and humidity data within the rack in real time. The AP-LEDIP can also be used to read the IP address of the unit, eliminating the need to use the discovery software. The external temperature / humidity probe can be used to monitor rack climate conditions to activate a cooling system if needed. Programmable alarm settings are easily configured with fault logs and fault reporting via the UI. The unit or individual outlets can be tested or monitored for active status via the Auto Ping Reset feature.

The AP-IP power distribution systems feature filtering for unwanted Radio Frequency Interference (RFI) that is commonly introduced into AC lines by nearby radio transmitters or wireless products that commonly deteriorate video signals and that can be heard as static in audio signals.

A removable 2m, 14-gauge IEC power cord with a retainer bracket is supplied with each unit to allow the installer to use a longer or shorter power cord length based on installation requirements (sold separately).

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Applications

The flexible AP-IP power distribution system family was designed with features enabling them to be used in a variety of applications. They can be used for AC distribution or for system power and protection against voltage surges or dropouts. They are ideal for systems that need to be powered On or Off at specific times to conserve energy or to monitor the system for faults and operability. The AP-IP power distribution systems also feature power conditioning and surge protection. The following are examples of applications where the AP-IP power distribution systems can be used:

Opening the Carton

Each unit carton contains an AP-IP power distribution system, power cord, power cord retainer clip & screws, temperature / humidity sensor probe, fault cable and LED data display. DO NOT plug the unit into an AC mains source until the following steps have been completed.

1. Install and secure the unit into the equipment rack.
2. Ensure the power switch is in the Off or down position.
3. Install the temperature / humidity probe in the rear port marked Sensor. **Note:** This is very important, or the unit will not function, and the front panel alarm LEDs will flash.
4. Install the remote LED Data display into the rear port marked Display.
5. Fault Report Port & Cable - This 3.5mm port mates with the supplied Fault cable. The 3-meter cable is 2-conductor with the wire ends bare allowing it to interface with an external device that supports contact closure GPIO. The port state is normal closed (NC) when the unit is active and opens when the AC power is Off or an alarm fault is detected such as voltage, current, temperature or humidity.
6. Install the power cord and retainer clip. The retainer clip mounts over the power cord IEC end and is secured by two screws. Below is an illustration showing how the power cord bracket mounts to the chassis.



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
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AP-IP Power Distribution System Family Overview

The AP-IP power distribution system series all have the same features with the only differences between models being the rack mounting type. The AP-S158IP is a vertical mount power strip with eight programable outlets. The AP-S15IP is a 19" rack mount power strip with eight programable rear outlets and 1 front panel unswitched outlet. The AP-S15HRIP is half rack, rack mount power strip with five programable rear outlets and 1 front panel switched outlet.

The AP-S15HRIP is half rack width rack mount power distribution system with five programable rear outlets and 1 front panel switched outlet.





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AP-S15IP

The AP-S15IP is a 19" rack mount power distribution system with eight programmable rear outlets and 1 front panel unswitched outlet.




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AP-S158IP

The AP-S158IP is a vertical mount power distribution system with eight programmable outlets.



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Unit Features



1. **AC Mains Input** - Connect the IEC 14-Gauge 6' (2m) power cord to a 15A 120VAC outlet to provide power to the unit. An IEC power cord retainer clip is included to prevent accidental removal of the power cord from the unit.
2. **AC Mains Power Switch and Breaker** - To turn the power strip ON or OFF, press the switch up to the ON position or down to the OFF position. When in the ON position, AC voltage is present, and the power switch will illuminate red. **Note:** This does not mean the switched AC outlets are active. For the switched AC outlets to be active, each outlet needs to be configured in the web interface. Factory default configuration is that all outlets will sequence ON when the power switch is turned ON. The AP-IP power distribution systems incorporate a power switch protection bar to prevent an accidental pressing of the power switch.

This AC Mains Power switch also serves as the AC Mains breaker. The 15A rated breaker will open if the combined draw of all AC outlets exceeds 15 amps. **Note:** The breaker is designed to exceed its rating for a short period of time. If the breaker is tripped, you must first remove the load from the power strip and then turn the switch OFF and then to ON to reset.
3. **AC Fault Indicator** - Although the clamping suppression circuit virtually assures protection from most transient voltage spikes and surges, nature has a way of occasionally creating electrical forces that are beyond the capabilities of any device to absorb without some degree of damage. In the rare instance that this occurs, and the circuit has been damaged, the "AC Fault" LED indicator will illuminate red. The unit disables all AC outlets until it is repaired. Be advised that activation of this fault condition, the associated repair is not covered under warranty. **Note:** If the AC Fault LED is illuminated, it is important to have all equipment that was connected to that AC mains line inspected for proper operation.
4. **Ground Status Indicator** - This LED will illuminate red when the power strip has no Earth Ground Connection on the Earth Ground Pin of the AC mains power cord. **Note:** If there is no Earth ground connection the LED will illuminate and the AC wall outlet must be repaired by an electrician before continuing. **Note:** Using a good quality power cord is essential to getting a solid ground connection. There are many cheap power cords that do not have a good ground connection that may cause the Ground LED to illuminate.
5. **Fault Report Port** - This 3.5mm port mates with the supplied Fault cable. The cable is a 3-meter, 2-conductor with the wire ends bare allowing to interface with an external device that supports contact closure GPIO. The port state is normal closed (NC) when the unit is active and opens when the AC Power is OFF or an alarm fault is detected such as voltage, current, temperature or humidity. This port is also ideally suited to interface with the AtlasIED Texas Tough rack series. When a fault is detected, the contacts open up and the LEDs in the crown (Top) of the Texas Tough rack change color to indicate there is an issue within the rack.
6. **LAN (Local Area Network) Ethernet Port** - Connect the amplifier to the network, local computer, or router/switch using CAT5 cable to access the unit's web interface and control settings.
7. **Sensor Probe (Temperature & Humidity) Port** - Each unit comes with a temperature/humidity probe that interfaces with the sensor port. This 9ft (3m) cable MUST be plugged into the sensor port or the unit will not function, and the alarm LEDs will flash ON/OFF. The sensor is located in the end of the cable and needs to be placed in the rack where the temperature or humidity are to be monitored. In most situations the best location is near the top of the rack. Both temperature and humidity can be monitored locally when using the AP-LEDIP display or remotely by using the web interface. The temperature and humidity data can be used to trigger alarms or be programmed to turn on AC Outlet #8 to activate a fan to cool the rack.

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Unit Features

8. **Remote LED Display Port (Included Accessory)** - This display control port mates with the included LED display, model AP-LEDIP. This display will provide a visual reference for the voltage, current, temperature or humidity data within the rack in real time. The AP-LEDIP can also be used to read the IP address of the unit eliminating the need to use the discovery software.
9. **AC Power Programmable Outlets** - The AP-S158IP and the AP-S15IP feature eight programmable NEMA 5-15P AC switched outlets and the AP-S15HRIP has five. These switched AC outlets are "live" when the front panel power switch is in the ON position and the outlet is activated via the WEB interface or by pressing the AC outlet indicator ON/OFF switch (see AC outlet Switches & indicators) If the AC outlet's corresponding outlet indicator is illuminated green, the AC outlet is active and AC voltage will be present.
10. **AC Outlet ON/OFF Switches and Indicators** - Each unit includes AC Outlet ON/OFF switches that also serve as outlet active indicators. Press the corresponding outlet switch firmly to manually turn a specific AC Outlet ON or OFF. The switch will illuminate green when the corresponding AC outlet is on. The AC outlets can also be activated by using the interface. **Note:** The AC Output ON/OFF function can be programmed to be disabled in the web interface.



Alarm Indicators - The AP-IP power distribution systems feature alarms for the following: Over & Under Voltage, Over Current, Over Temperature and Over Humidity. All alarm settings are programmed in the web UI. If an alarm is activated, the associated LED will illuminate and the fault contacts will open.



Factory Reset Switch - The Factory Reset switch is located in the front panel as indicated in the picture below. Insert a small object like a paper clip into the hole to access the switch. Gently press and hold the switch inward for 3 seconds, then release. The unit's outlets and display will shut off and turn back on indicating the Factory Reset was successful. The Factory Reset switch will reset all functions that were previously programmed and will also reset the unit to accept DHCP IP address. **Note:** Any custom passwords will be replaced by the last 4 digits of the MAC address. Before resetting the unit, it is important to write down any special settings that may have been adjusted. Refer to the section Logging into the Unit for details.



11. **Unswitched Outlet (Not Shown in AP-S158IP)**
 - A Unswitched AC outlet is not programmable
 - The AP-S15IP has an unswitched AC outlet that is always live even if the AC mains power switch is in the OFF position. This outlet is protected by the AC mains breaker, surge protection and by RF filtering.
 - The AP-S15HRIP has a switched AC outlet that is turned ON/OFF with the AC mains power switch. This outlet is protected by the AC mains breaker, surge protection and by RF filtering

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Installing the AP-IP Power Distribution System

Note: AtlasIED requires that the AP-IP Power Distribution Systems be installed by a qualified electrician or IT technician. Before starting installation, the manual must be read in its entirety.

Plugging Equipment Into An Outlet

After the unit has been installed in a rack, equipment can be connected to it. There are a few things to consider before starting. **Note:** The AtlasIED IP power distribution systems must be installed by qualified technician. Before proceeding, visit atlasied.com to obtain an installation manual. Read the manual entirely before proceeding with the installation of this product.

1. Total current draw of the power strip cannot exceed 12A continuous signal or 15A IT / Audio applications or the AC Mains 15A Breaker may trip. Every product should have a current draw rating, add up all the equipment's total current and make sure it doesn't exceed 1440W.
Note: Pay special attention to audio amplifiers, they typically consume the most power compared to processors or controllers.
2. Audio amplifiers should turn on last, and off first in a sequence.
3. If a computer or router needs to be on all of the time, an outlet can be programmed to stay on for that operation.

Rack Mounting the AP-S15HRIP

A rack kit is included with the purchase of the AP-S15HRIP. The AP-S15HR width fits most rack cabinets that are classified as half-width. There are no industry standards for these types of racks and rack widths may vary between manufactures. The AP-S15HRIP can be mounted into an AtlasIED wall mount half-width rack or a 19" rack. The AP-S15HRIP can be mounted with any AtlasIED 1/2 RU products or mounted alone, but requires a rack mount kit. For half rack designs there needs to be a minimum distance of 9.25" between rails. AtlasIED recommends checking the distance between the rack rail opening before proceeding. **Note:** Two AP-S15HRIP units cannot be mounted side by side.



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Configuration 1 - Mounting a Single 1 RU Model

1. Remove amplifier from electrical source.
2. Remove the four feet.
3. Align and secure the chassis extension plate to a rack mount ear with the enclosed screws and nuts.
4. Locate the two open holes on each side of the amp located towards the front panel.
5. Align the enclosed rack mount ear and extension assembly to the chassis holes located in step 4.
6. Use the enclosed chassis screws to attach the rack ears and extension assembly to the chassis. Secure firmly, do not over tighten. Repeat step for opposite chassis side.
7. Disregard extra pieces.
8. Ready for rack installation. **Note:** It is important the amplifiers have the proper clearance around it for proper heat dissipation. Always allow at least 1.75" around the amplifier for to assure safe operation. Never mount an amplifier in an enclosed air tight rack. All racks must have air vents on all sides or forced air cooling to assure proper heat dissipation.




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Configuration 2 - Mounting 2 1RU Models

Note: Not all 1RU half rack models can be joined next to each other. The following combinations can be joined: ASP-MG2240, DPA102PM, MA40G, MA60G, PA40G, PA60G, AP-S15HR, AP-S15RTHR, and AP-S15HRIP are interchangeable. **Note:** Two AP-S15HR units cannot be rack mounted together side-by-side. Call AtlasIED for other models not listed.


1. Remove amplifier from electrical source.
2. Remove the four feet.
3. Align and secure two chassis joiner plates with the enclosed screws to the top of units. **Note:** Must install both plates, one towards the front and one towards the back.
4. Locate the two open holes on each side of the amp located towards the front panel.
5. Align the enclosed rack mount ear to the chassis holes located in step 2.
6. Use the enclosed chassis screws to attach the rack ears to the chassis. Secure firmly, do not over tighten. Repeat step for opposite chassis side.
7. Install the front panel joiner plate using the two 4-40 x 3/8 flat head black screws. **Note:** The front panel joiner plate can be removed after the unit is installed in the rack.
8. Disregard extra pieces.
9. Ready for rack installation. **Note:** It is important the amplifiers have the proper clearance around it for proper heat dissipation. Always allow at least 1.75" around the amplifier for to assure safe operation. Never mount an amplifier in an enclosed air tight rack. All racks must have air vents on all sides or forced air cooling to assure proper heat dissipation.



Note: Not all 1RU half rack models can be joined next to each other. Refer to the list above or call AtlasIED Customer Service.

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Accessing the Unit's Web UI Interface

The AtlasIED AP-IP power distribution system's GUI control panel is designed to be accessed via the LAN (Local Area Network) or local computer. External software is not required for operation. The Web browser UI control interface software is embedded in the unit. Remote access to the device can be set up through a VPN connection by working with the client or facility's IT administrator.

Finding the Unit's IP Address

There are two methods to find the unit's IP address in DHCP mode, using the AP-LEDIP display or by using the discovery software. **Note:** All AtlasIED AP-IP power distribution systems ship (factory default) in DHCP mode.

1. AP-LEDIP IP Discovery

Using the AP-LEDIP external display is the fastest way to discover the IP Address. Plug the AP-LEDIP display into the unit's display port. On the display, press and hold down the viewing selection button until the IP address starts to scroll across the display. An IP address read out example would be 192.168.1.138.



2. Discovery Software

The user can search the LAN for connected units using a specified range of IP addresses within the LAN. To do so, the router's range assignment of IP address must be known. This IP address range must be entered into the AP-IP Discovery Software. An IT technician can provide the IP address range assigned or, if the computer Network Interface Card (NIC) card is on the same LAN, this IP address can be selected and it will auto fill the range of IP addresses that are needed to be scanned. The discovery software can be found at www.atlasied.com/ip-enabled-power-distribution.


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
IP Scan Range

In this section of the discovery software enter the Start and End range of the IP address search. Select the drop-down arrow in the "Select NIC" window. The number listed in this window is the IP address of the computer's NIC. Select the IP address and it will auto fill the Start and End IP fields. **Note:** The NIC auto fill feature only works with computers running the Windows® operating system and not work with Apple® computers running MacOS.


- Click on the "Select NIC" drop down arrow



- After the NIC IP address is selected the Start IP & End IP fields will autofill



- Select "Start Scan" and the discovery software will search the LAN for AP-IP products within the IP range listed. Units discovered will be listed by their IP address, unit name, model name & MAC address




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
Logging Into the Unit

Each unit has a unique password assigned to it. Enter the unit's factory default password as show in the illustration below. The password is the last 4 digits of the MAC address. Find the MAC address label on the chassis. Example: A MAC address looks like (40-D8-55-10-D0-66). Input D066 (No dash) as the password to access the unit. **Note:** For "0" equals zero.

Using any internet browser, enter in the units IP address in the address bar to access the unit's web UI. Enter the unit's assigned IP address in the following format (http://192.168.1.138) or click on a device and the AtlasIED Login page will appear if using the discovery software. Enter in the factory password.



After entering the unit's password, the unit's GUI will open to the status page. Once at the Status page the user will have full access to all pages, programming functions and the factory default password can be changed.




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Static IP Address

This setting can be found in the web interface under the Network Settings page. Static mode can be selected, and the Static IP address, Subnet Mask and Gateway can be entered. **Note:** If the selection is changed to "Static," the user must select "Save" and the unit's power must reset the power switch.





- Factory default is 132V for "HI" voltage and 88V for "LO" voltage settings.
- Voltage Alarm Recovery can be set to Auto Recover or Manual Reset. With Auto Recover, if the alarm is triggered and the AC outlets are shut Off and the AC mains voltage is within the safe operating parameters, all outlets will turn back On automatically. If set to Manual Reset, the AC mains need to be within the safe operating parameters and the panel power switch needs to be manually cycled.
- If the alarms are activated these indicators turn red and all switched AC outlets will turn Off at the same time. These outlets will remain Off and the indicator will remain red until the values are within the safe operating range.


6. Incoming AC Mains Surge Protection Indicator

- If the alarms are activated these indicators will turn red and all switched AC outlets will turn Off at the same time. These outlets will remain Off and the indicator will remain red until the values are within safe operating range.
- When the alarm is activated and the Voltage Alarm indicator is red in the GUI, the front panel OC / OV LED will also be illuminated.
- The fault reason, day and time will be recorded in the Alarm Activation log section located at the bottom of the Alarm page. See fault log information section.

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11. **Voltage Alarm Recovery** - Manual Reset or Auto Recovery

- Voltage Alarm Recovery can be set to Auto Recover or Manual Reset.
- Auto Recover selection, if the alarm is triggered and the AC outlets are shut Off and the AC mains voltage is within the safe operating parameters, all outlets will turn back On automatically.
- Manual Reset selection, if the alarm is triggered and the AC outlets are shut Off, and even if the AC mains voltage is within the safe operating parameters, all outlets will remain Off until the front panel power switch is cycled.



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
